Topic: **"Use of Riparian Birds as Bioindicators"**.

A good quick description is that the talk will focus on the use of the Louisiana Waterthrush as a bioindicator of headwater stream ecological integrity and the use of colonially nesting Great Egrets and Black-crowned Night-Herons for the same purpose downstream on a much large river, the Susquehanna. In both situations, regardless of where one is within the watershed, these species of birds can act as barometers of environmental health by virtue of measurable responses to human impacts on their respective environments.

"Terry Master has been interested in birds since he was around 6 years old. He pursued this interest academically through his undergraduate years at Muhlenberg College in Allentown, then at East Stroudsburg University where he received his Masters Degree and finally at Lehigh University where he earned his Ph.D. in Animal Behavior and Ornithology in 1989.
